We were able to see a German Christmas complete with the many different traditions of the households we visited. It was surprising how many people use real candles on their Christmas trees! Our visit started in Hamburg visiting friends, Bill and Angelika Neel and their new baby Allison Marie and we stayed with two wonderful friends, Erika and Jürgen Krüger. Then we spent Christmas Eve in Kassel with Mary's aunt and uncle, Dida and Gerd. They had guests from mainland China - two couples and dinner conversation was fascinating. From there several days were spent in Nürnberg with Mary's cousin, Alex, his wife, Chris, and their two children, Boris and Iris. We were able to see Mary's grandmother's grave. She had died of a heart attack the previous September at the age of 89. Leaving Nürnberg we took

the train through East Germany to West Berlin. The Brandenburg Gate had just opened and we of course chipped away at the wall. We shopped, spent a day in East Berlin, and wondered at the great changes taking place in Germany. Our last evening was spent in Würzburg with a German teacher and his wife. They came to Rochester, along with 12 students for an exchange at Mary's school in September 1990.

Mary was put on disability because of early complications in the pregnancy, but things seem to be working themselves out. It will be the first grandchild for both of our families. The future grandparents are thrilled and she was due on December 5, but as of this letter (December 15th), Baby Myers has still not chosen to appear.
