
Wow, 2006 was some year! The newsletter is late as the year was just so busy toward the end.

Christmas Eve 2005 we spent with Christine and Peter, Mary's Mom and Dad. We had a traditional Ukrainian







February brought many birthdays including Peter who turned 93.



We spent Easter in Lake George at Sandie and Vin's house. Florence, Vin's mom was also there.



with a lot of support from family and friends, especially Baba and Digo.






